Dear Sisters in Christ:

It is a blessing to be a junior counselor for LWML. I have watched and supported the ministry of LWML over the last 20 years. It is exciting to see the many ministries of LWML. People enjoy and feel the accomplishments of the LWML grants. The meetings are great times of connecting and meeting new people. New relationships are formed through zone meetings and congregations are interconnected. For me the fellowship is encouraging and uplifting. Above all what I love best about LWML is its love for our Savior and Lord Jesus Christ. The disciple ministry of LWML is what truly defines LWML.

Mission Outreach

PRAISE GOD FROM WHOM ALL BLESSINGS FLOW!

As of mid-August 2008, we have paid Mission Grants #1 through #5:

- MG#1 – Camp Scholarship at SonRise (\$3,000)
- MG#2 – Ministry to Armed Forces, Ministry-by-Mail (\$3,600)
- MG#3 – Lutheran Braille Workers, Inc. (\$3,500)
- MG#4 – Bible Club for Kids (\$4,000)
- MG#5 – Bibles for Atlantic District Prisons (\$2,500)

Our next Mission Grants to be funded are MG#6 and 7:

Mission Grant #6 – Seminary Tuition - \$5,000

This grant will help to pay part of the tuition for a Vicar in the DELTO program and thus lead to ordination as an LCMS pastor. St. Timothy in Hyde Park is currently in vacancy. They recently made arrangements for a Vicar (DELTO pastoral candidate) to serve while taking distance learning courses at seminary. (Sponsored by Nancy Graf Peters, LWML member)

We need \$4,594.08 in mite donations to pay MG #6.

Mission Grant #7 – ZAP! Youth Training Program - \$1,600.00

This program will help to continue the initial year of ZAP! to strengthen faith, become more comfortable in sharing their faith and to engage in real life venues to many youth from the Atlantic District. The program will have five scheduled training sessions (located throughout the region), three summer trips to partner with Atlantic District congregations to provide a Vacation Bible School, evangelism outreach and work projects. (Sponsored by Parish Education and Youth Task Force, Atlantic District)

We are excited and encouraged by your mite donations! Thank you for all your support and keep the Atlantic District LWML Mission Grant goals in your prayers.

Devotions

THE GIFT OF WISDOM

If any of you lacks wisdom, he should ask God, who gives generously to all without finding fault, and it will be given to him.
James 1:5 NIV

When young King Solomon asked God for wisdom, he so pleased His Heavenly Father that he received not just great wisdom but also abundant wealth and long life as well. Why was that request so generously filled? Just what is wisdom?

The Merriam-Webster Collegiate Dictionary (Tenth Edition) gives these definitions: *ability to discern inner qualities and relationships, insight, good sense, judgment*. Wisdom is also defined as *accumulated philosophic or scientific learning, knowledge*. However, when wisdom is spoken of in moral terms, discernment and judgment are involved. According to the Concordia Self-Study Bible, wisdom is “practical insight with spiritual implications.”

The best definition of wisdom is found in scripture. In Ps. 111:10 we read, *"The fear of the Lord is the beginning of wisdom; all who follow his precepts have good understanding. To him belongs eternal praise."* What does it mean to fear the Lord?

In modern speech the word fear usually means to be afraid of something. But in this context fear refers to *reverential awe of God*. So if we are to be wise, we need to get our priorities in order and recognize that understanding what He wants (the will of God) is where we must begin. "What would the Lord want me to do?" must be our first question when we are confronted with a decision. We need to turn to our Heavenly Father by reading His Word regularly. As we become familiar with what He says to us, we get a head start on knowing what He wants us to do in any particular situation. And we need to turn to our Heavenly Father in prayer about what we are facing, ask His guidance and He will lead us, as St. James assures us in the verse at the beginning of this article.

In chapter 3:13 of his letter St. James also advises, *"Who is wise and understanding among you? Let him show it by his good life, by deeds done in the humility that comes from wisdom."* In humility, in denial of self, we are then prepared to be molded by God and receive even more wisdom. In this process we see all the more clearly, our hearts become all the more humble, and God continues to make us all the more wise. We start out in prayer and study, humbly submitting to God's direction His holy will. Then, of course, when we see the results of good judgment, of the wisdom He grants us, we are humbled by the knowledge that our own human solutions to the problems we have been wrestling with make a poor comparison with the ones the Lord leads us to consider.

Seeing God's will and direction more clearly, our hearts are filled with thanks and praise. Receiving God's gift of wisdom, our hearts of faith yearn to know His counsel as we make decisions each day.

CROSSING “JORDAN” JESUS GOES BEFORE US AND IS WITH US

Before Moses is called home, as his 40 years of faithful leadership come to an end, and before he enters his eternal rest, he addresses Israel and Joshua about God’s plan for them. Since he will not be privileged to enter the Promised Land, it is necessary to assure God’s people of His continual presence and provision, and to remind them of His promise and His purpose and plan for them. Hence, he not only declares to them that God will go ahead of them as protector, provider, and deliverer, but assures them of his provision in Joshua; the new successor and leader, a faithful and courageous warrior, associate, and Israelite, whose name means “Savior.” He reminds the people of God’s promise to go with them, and to never leave or forsake them. As Yahweh (“I Am), He will make full provision, just as He did when they were miraculously delivered from Egyptian oppression and bondage, and were led through the Red Sea to safety and freedom.

With the close of Moses’ extraordinary and exceptional leadership, Joshua and the people of Israel must ready themselves for a journey without this spiritual giant. Forty years of wandering and testing, and now they must leave a barren and hostile, but perhaps familiar wilderness, to proceed forward into unknown, unfamiliar, and unconquered terrain. They are challenged to accept God’s words spoken through Moses to be strong and courageous, to not be afraid or terrified, and to be obedient to his commands. In the presence of all the people, Joshua too, is encouraged to be strong and courageous, and is reminded of God’s faithful promise to the patriarchs and forefathers never to leave or forsake them, and of the need for obedience.

What a huge and formidable task for Joshua! What big shoes to fill! Trusting God’s promise, Joshua remained obedient as he stepped out in faith, believing in his abiding presence and Word. As he leads the people across the Jordan River, Yahweh once again provides the dry path needed to cross safely to the other side where Joshua’s leadership would continue to be developed, tested, stretched, and challenged. In obedience, twelve stones are placed in the river as a memorial of this supernatural event and God’s power. As they take courage and are strengthened, Joshua and the Israelites press forward to know victory after victory as they inherit the land promised. As they battle, trust, and obey God, he makes provision over and over again, remaining true to his Word and promise.

This same promise holds true for us as Christian women, as disciples of Jesus, as members and workers of our respective parishes, or as members of the

executive body of the LWML. As we cross our own “Jordan” to enter new or unfamiliar terrains where we are called to lead and labor in the Lord’s vineyard, we need to take courage and know that we are not alone. Like the Israelites and Joshua who needed to be reminded of God’s continual faithfulness, presence, and promise, we are also reminded that in his Son, Christ Jesus, our Savior and Redeemer and the Holy Spirit, complete provision has been made for us, for his people, and for the Church.

Although we may feel overwhelmed by the unfamiliarity, gravity, or enormity of a task or job, we can be assured that our Lord is with us and that he will not forsake us. Supported by God and empowered by Him, we can face each challenge in our journey, and be confident that our Lord is not only with us, but has actually gone before us when he returned to Jerusalem, and when he journeyed to Golgotha. In his going before us as Savior and Redeemer, he has defeated the grave, sin, and given us forgiveness, salvation and life eternal.

Whatever stressors, problems or challenges we face, we can be assured that his Word is true for we are “more than conquerors through him who loved us.” Be strong, take courage, and remember when crossing your ‘Jordan’ to always revisit your baptismal waters where we are made children of God, redeemed from the power and grip of Satan, forgiven, saved from eternal condemnation, and given life. We joyfully run to feast on the Body and Blood of Christ for it is this Feast of Love which strengthens and keeps us in this Christian faith, standing in victory during every battle, challenge, or task as Christian women, and as leaders.

As Joshua was sent, so we are sent. As Christ’s disciples and as the children of God the Father, be not afraid and have no fear for he is always with us, “to the very end of the age.” Be confident for “we can do all things through Christ, who strengthens us” as we trust his promises, hear and obey his Word, and receive the Sacraments.

Printed below is a picture of our group working on Lutheran World Relief Quilts, Layettes, Health Kits and School Kits. We traditionally meet the third Friday of every month.

To date we have assembled 663 health kits, 135 quilts, 737 layettes and 266 school kits for Lutheran World Relief. We are very grateful for the support of our congregation and the financial help from Thrivent as well as the local King Kullen (in Setauket) who has a rebate program which helps us in paying for the mailing of these kits to the LWR warehouse in Maryland. Currently the warehouse reports that their contributions are the same, but there have been so many world disasters that their supply is dwindling. Many more supplies are needed.

When we are done assembling the kits, we box them and put them up by our altar. Our Pastor prays for the recipients of these kits before they are mailed off.

We also try to support the work of Global Health Ministries who support Lutheran Missions. They are in need of 30 inch by 30 inch baby blankets and cotton bandages.

We send cancelled stamps to Linda Bizzaro, chairman of the stamp project. The money received from the sale of the stamps goes to the Interpreter's Fund of the AD LWML.

We buy honey to support the Boys and Girls Camp in North Dakota.

We try to mark Bibles for the Lutheran Prison Ministry run by Allen D. Hanson. For more information your society can go to <http://www.ylm.org/prisonministry>.
