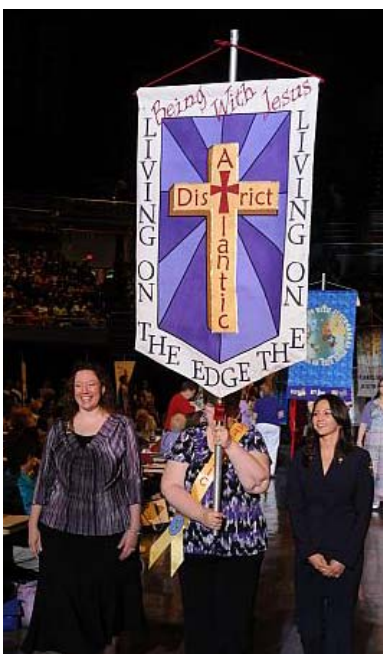

THE LWML 34TH BIENNIAL CONVENTION IN PEORIA

Peoria! Peoria! Peoria! Here comes Ladies in Prayer and Service (LIPS) from Redeemer Evangelical Lutheran Church in the Bronx, but can we get there with American Airlines. Let's see...cancellation of flight, change from one airport to the next, from LaGuardia to Kennedy via Miami to Chicago then at last to Peoria, sleep deprived, several hours of traveling and plane hopping would make anyone weary and worn. How did we deal with it? By not letting the devil win, and it was exactly what seven ladies of "LIPS" did, by standing firm against the devil and his forces in order to get to Peoria to enjoy the convention with its many settings. It was like "Living on the Edge with Jesus" as was our convention theme.

Check this out—I received an email at 8:30PM to pre-board for our flight leaving at 7:20AM on Wednesday from LaGuardia Airport to Chicago then to Peoria. I did consider doing that, but since I was drying my hair, I put it off for later and wanted to consult with my fellow travelers. At about 9:15PM, the bottom fell out; I heard the phone ring, looked at it and assumed that it must be telemarketers, so I let the answering machine pick it up. To my surprise, it was American Airlines informing me that the flight was cancelled. I thought I was hearing things so I played the answering machine over and over again trying to make sense of the situation because less than an hour ago they offered me the chance to pre-board. I felt all the pins in my hair sticking me like thorns. Then, I decided I will not let the devil defeat me. I aimed to let God take charge, so I sprung into action and called some of my fellow travelers to see if they got the same message about the cancellation. After speaking to our LIPS President, she informed me that American Airlines put her and two others on a later flight and the rest on Thursday. I called American Airlines and the representative who came on the line informed me that the flight was cancelled due to weather conditions, in which I informed her that my daughter checked the weather conditions in both Chicago and Peoria and it was only cloudy and some drizzle and was expected to clear up in the afternoon; she remained quiet; and proceeded to put me on another flight leaving on Thursday. I told her I need to get to Peoria on Wednesday, that we were going to a convention and have planned activities for Thursday early morning. She said the only flight that was available for Wednesday was leaving from Kennedy via Miami, Chicago, then onto Peoria. I had no option but to take that flight. I inquired about the rest of the group, only to learn that the flight that three of them were supposed to be on did not leave. The previous American Airlines representative who spoke with the LIPS President did not put them on the flight.

We had to start all over again in order to try and get a flight for all members on Wednesday via conversations between each party to get four on the early morning, two on the afternoon and one on the evening flight. According to the representative, that was the best that she had to offer for Wednesday and in order to arrange it, each member had to call to confirm her flight. I told her that we booked as a group; she said that because we paid individually, we are no longer a group so she cannot confirm a flight for the others. I told her, "I cannot hang up and let them call, because if you are telling me that the flight is filling up as we speak, it would be impossible for them to get through to American Airlines in order to get on the flights." So she said the only way she would confirm the others was if I were to get them on the phone and she could hear our conversation with each other. With the house phone in one hand I dialed the LIPS President with my cell phone to let her know what was happening with the flight that she thought the three of them were on. With conversations back and forth we were able to secure seats for all on three flights on Wednesday with everyone located and confirmation.

You would think that was the end of it. NO---the devil steps in again. An American Airlines representative called two of the LIPS members who were on the afternoon flight to put them back on the Thursday flight. The member who got the call first stood her ground in order for them to be on the afternoon flight.

When we finally reached Chicago, four of us who were on the round about flight from New York met a fellow passenger going to Peoria and learned that she was on the original flight that American Airlines stated that was cancelled due to weather and air traffic control. She booked two days before the flight and paid only \$300, and we booked since March 2011 and paid almost double the amount. Can you believe that! Here we were trying our best to get on a flight only to learn that it was no problem for another person.

You know what we can take from this? Living on the edge with Jesus is not easy, but He will carry you through even when the devil is putting up road blocks. When we are on a mission for Jesus Christ, we are to look to Him for help and guidance. The devil will not prevail because nothing is impossible with God. When we are living on the edge by ourselves, it will get us no where, but if we are living on the edge with Jesus, He will be our constant guide and will protect us from all of the devil's obstacles.

PEORIA CONVENTION: TRAVEL WOES LIPS LADIES TRAVELLING TO PEORIA



On Tuesday, June 21, about 9:30pm, I received a recorded message from American Airlines saying, "Your flight for June 22, at 7:20am to Chicago/Peoria is cancelled. You are on a flight leaving Thursday, June 23, at 9:15am. If you want to speak to an agent say Agent".

I panicked and said, "Agent! Agent! Agent! Please." I told the agent Thursday **WILL NOT AND CAN NOT WORK.** We have to leave on Wednesday because I made arrangements and paid for a tour for 9:00 am on Thursday. The agent said, "You can get a refund."; I said, "Not this late"; she said, "I can get you to Chicago and then you can drive to Peoria."; I said "I live in New York I do not drive".

All travel arrangements were made and paid for on March 24, 2011, for departure on Wednesday, June 22, from NY LaGuardia Airport at 7:20am to Chicago O'Hare to Peoria International Airport.

SHORT! SHORT! VERSION: After speaking to three agents for over three hours, they split up the group.

1. Cecile, Charlotte, Daphne and Joan were to leave on Wednesday, June 22 at 5:20am from JFK to Miami, Chicago O'Hare to Peoria International Airport. The flight from NY to Chicago and Peoria should have taken about three and a half hours; it took us over ten hours to get to Peoria.
2. Elenore and Lucille were scheduled to depart on Wednesday, June 22, from NY LaGuardia Airport at 2:15pm to Chicago/Peoria. After I had confirmed Lucille and Elenore's flight for 2:15pm on Wednesday, Lucille received a call at 6:00 am Wednesday telling her the flight is canceled and they will be leaving on Thursday, June 23 at 9:15 am. After more than an hour with the agent, Lucille was told there was a flight leaving at 1:15pm if they could get to the airport in time.
3. Marlena leaves Wednesday, June 22, from NY LaGuardia Airport at 4:40pm to Chicago/Peoria. When Marlena arrived in Chicago, the flight to Peoria was delayed for over three hours.



HOW TO SUBMIT A MISSION GRANT PROPOSAL TO THE ATLANTIC DISTRICT LWML

Is there a mission project in your congregation or zone that would benefit from a grant from the Atlantic District LWML? Have you ever wondered how you, your society, or zone could request a grant for that mission project? The following information might be of help.

WHO MAY SUBMIT A MISSION GRANT PROPOSAL?

- Any individual LWML member, society or zone.
- LCMS boards, LCMS approved organizations, or LCMS District Task Forces.
Mission grants proposals outside the United States, Canada, or the District can be considered a District project.

WHERE WILL I GET MY IDEAS FOR A MISSION GRANT PROPOSAL?

- Consider the needs of mission outreach programs of your congregation.
- Look to your community for special ministries for the under-privileged, the aged, developmentally challenged, family concerns, Christian counseling, rehabilitation programs.
- Are there educational needs in the LCMS school system?
Consider financial support of students entering LCMS Synodical colleges to train for full-time church vocations, including seminary students.

ONCE I HAVE AN IDEA FOR A MISSION GRANT PROPOSAL, WHAT DO I DO?

- 1 Consider the Atlantic District LWML criteria for Mission Grant Proposals:**
 - ◇ Be mission in emphasis, extending the ministry of the Word.
 - ◇ Be current and ready for implementation.
 - ◇ Be well-documented.
 - ◇ Must not be for renovations, repair work, or certain equipment.
 - ◇ Must not necessitate a permanent subsidy from the funds.
 - ◇ Must not be used to cover deficits or shortages.
- 2 Research the project by asking a few questions:**
 - ◇ Does it extend the ministry of the Word by “reaching the unreached?”
 - ◇ Does it fall within the criteria stated above.
 - ◇ Who will be the contact person if the project is adopted?
 - ◇ How many people will benefit from this project?

NOW THAT I HAVE THE INFORMATION, HOW DO I PREPARE A GRANT PROPOSAL?

Your mission grant proposal application should be completed with **ONE (1) ORIGINAL & EIGHT (8) COPIES** and should consist of two parts:

1. The Mission Grant Application
2. Supporting Information for the application

5. A follow-up notification will indicate if the proposal has been selected by the delegates at the convention.
